is a compilation of interviews with various women who work or have worked in the radio industry primarily in Toronto, Canada. The interviews were conducted as part of a research project which seeks to collect information about women's experiences of and perceptions about working in radio — an industry which, like all media industries, has traditionally been male-dominated.
