Role of PDA in Collection Development

- As project
 - Gap filling (missing items, multiple copies, new programs, etc.)
 - Pilot to plan for future initiatives
 - Consortia project
- As ongoing collection development tool
 - In addition to slip and approval plan
 - Slip replacement
 - Approval plan replacement

Vendor Selection Criteria

- Existing relationships/experiences with vendors
- Tools provided by vendors (Ease of selection, management, invoicing, etc.)
- Licensing agreement with publishers
- Acquisition options (lease, rental, short-term loan, purchase, local load, trigger criteria, etc.)

Profile Selection Consideration

- Depends on role of PDA in collection development
- By subject or classification, by publisher/imprint, librarian mediated
- Price cap, publication year, language
- What to exclude: textbooks, handbooks, self-help, etc.

Workflow

- Marc records – retrieval, load, overlay and deletion
- Refreshing discovery pool
- Weekly reporting
- Unexpected discoveries

- Usage – Counter book report 2
- Cost per title
- Print duplicates' usage
- Subject librarian selection
